LIVING LIFE BACKWARD

How Ecclesiastes Teaches Us to Live Life in Light of the End

What has most stood out to you from Ecclesiastes?

As we review, think "Where do I need to be changed?"

- Chapter 1: "Vanity [breath] of vanities..." (Eccl 1:1)
 - Life is a breath
 - Your life comes and goes, and no one will remember you
 - Only by preparing to die will we know how to live
- Chapter 2: "all was vanity [breath] and a striving after wind..." (Eccl 2:11)
 - Nothing Satisfies (Wisdom, Pleasure, Work, Wealth)
 - All result in <u>death</u>
 - Don't expect satisfaction in fleeting things, just enjoy them as a gift from God

- Chapter 3: "For everything there is a season..." (Eccl 3:1)
 - There is a wisdom and beauty in the rhythms of life, even if we can't see it
 - God's eternal nature provides comfort against the darkness
 - Enjoy today as a gift, but it will change
- Chapter 4: "...the dead who are already dead are more fortunate than the living...Two are better than one" (Eccl 4:2,9)
 - There is terrible oppression in the world
 - Oppression also hurts the oppressor
 - Not lazy, not overly busy
 - Happiness is found in a "we" mentality, serving one another

- Chapter 5: "Guard your steps when you go to the house of God..." (Eccl 5:1)
 - God wants undivided, authentic worshippers (Deut 6:4-9)
 - Come to listen, not to put on an empty show
 - Fear God!
- Chapter 6: (BONUS) God is the giver of all gifts (life, wealth, honor) and He alone satisfies and knows their purpose.
- Chapter 7: "...I turned my heart to know and to search out and to seek wisdom" (Eccl 7:25)
 - Wisdom is good (pursue it!)
 - Wisdom is limited
 - So trust God (peace and joy) and fear him

- Chapter 9: "This is an evil in all that is done under the sun, that the same event happens to all." (Eccl 9:3)
 - Every man dies. Not every man really lives.
 - "Go, eat your bread with joy, and drink your wine with a merry heart, for God has already approved what you do." (Eccl 9:7)
 - "Whatever you do, do your work heartily..." (Col 3:23)
 - Hold onto life with open hands
 - Life is uncertain; Trust in God alone (James 4:13-15)

- Chapter 11:1-6 "Cast your bread upon the waters..." (Eccl 11:1)
 - Life is uncertain
 - Be Generous
 - Don't get hung up on success or failure
 - Live wisely
- Chapter 11:7-12:8 "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth..."
 - When old, you want to look back on a life well-lived
 - When young, live well
 - Rejoice
 - Remove Vexation
 - Remember God

EXPECTED SUMMARY

- Your life is temporary, so don't waste it pursuing vanity
- Instead, live life before God to the fullest and enjoy it as a gift
- Live wisely, but trust in God


WORDS

- Truth and Delight go hand-in-hand

WORDS OF THE WISE

- Goad
 - We are foolish, like dumb sheep!
 - We go astray
 - We need help to go the right way!
- The truth can hurt (and that's a good thing!)
- "These are sharp words from a loving Shepherd"
 - So "Remember your Creator" by letting his truth confront your folly.
 - Embrace the truth, even when it hurts!
- What are some examples of painful truth in Ecclesiastes?

A WISDOM TEST

- Do you delight in God's word? (Psalm 19:7-10)
- When was the last time you embraced something painful in Scripture?
 - Truth
 - Difficult command

THE END OF THE MATTER

"Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man."

- All of life: Primarily God-oriented
- Proverbs 9:10 "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom..."
- Live life wisely with regards to your Creator
 - Who am I?
 - Creature
 - Sinful
 - Who is God?
 - Creator
 - Father
 - Judge

PREPARATION

- Prepare for what is coming
 - Death
 - Judgment
 - God will put all the wrongs right (Isaiah 5:20)
 - We should prepare to meet Him
 - These need not be feared by the believer
- The opposite
 - Avoid the hard truth
 - Pretend God doesn't exist
 - Pretend you will not be judged
 - Pretend that you are "good enough"

PREPARATION

• "To live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Phil 1:21)

 "Your death and the judgment to follow – the great fixed points of your life – are the very things that can reach back from the future into today and transform the life God has given you to live."
